The current Issues group met May 11 and we had a most interesting and animated discussion about the issues and candidates to be considered before voting in the Mayoral election on Monday June 26.







Chris and Susan pointed out the highlights in the birthday booklet (thanks to Ellen and Dorothy) with a few additional very interesting comments. It was also very entertaining to hear about the house at 162 St. George St. Imagine women buying property in 1929! There are some great stories about the B and B!
